Our pan-disability panel is made up of over 4,000 disabled and older people

We are proud that the RiDC Panel includes people with a broad spectrum of impairments, health conditions and disabilities.

The size of our panel also means that we are able to cover a diverse variety of other characteristics that provide additional insight to our clients and allow us to target our research effectively.

When they join our panel, panel members tell us about:

- P Impairment or disability type
- Age, gender identity, location and ethnicity
- Ways in which their impairment or disability affects them
- Use of mobility, vision, hearing and communication aids
- Use of digital technology
- Property type, home adaptions and use of equipment
- Access to a car or wheelchair accessible vehicle (WAV)
- Use of public transport

Our panel use many types of accessibility aids and equipment



76% of our panel use a mobility aid

48% use a wheelchair all, or part, of the time.



16% use at least one aid for their hearing (hearing aids, amplifiers, TV adaptors, flashing lights etc)




17% use at

Our panel use a range of technology to access the internet






77% of panel members use a computer or laptop to access the internet.



House = 51%


Bungalow = 21%

Ground floor flat / maisonette = 12%


Upper floor flat / maisonette = 7%

79% have bathroom equipment to help meet their accessibility needs




50% have specific furniture to help meet their accessibility needs
